



# DIY Basic Survival Kit

<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Water: 3 gallons of water per person</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Buy 1 <a href="#">Water Container</a> (this will be enough for 2 people) or 1 case of water bottles</li> <li>You may need to store the water in a separate place from your emergency kit in case of leakage, such as in your garage or shed</li> <li>Optional items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LifeStraw Personal <a href="#">Water Filter</a> or Water Purification <a href="#">Tablets</a></li> <li>Collapsible <a href="#">Water Bag</a></li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Food</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Buy 3600-calorie <a href="#">Food Bars</a> (1 per person)</li> <li>Remember to rotate the food; the Food Bars last for 5 years</li> <li>Optional items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Non-perishable comfort <a href="#">food</a>/hard <a href="#">candy</a></li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>FM/AM/NOAA Weather Radio; Flashlight; Cell Phone Charger (1 per family)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Buy an <a href="#">all-in-one</a> radio/flashlight/cellphone charger that doesn't use batteries</li> <li>If you have a radio/flashlight that needs batteries, make sure you store extra batteries</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Cell Phone and Backup Battery (1 per adult)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I personally don't have a cell phone just for emergencies, but my cell phone &amp; charger are at the top of my Emergency Packing List</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>First Aid Kit (1 per family)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This <a href="#">kit</a> even contains an emergency blanket</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Whistle (1 per person)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You can get a cool <a href="#">survival bracelet</a> that has a Whistle, Flint Fire Starter, Emergency Scraper/Knife, &amp; Rescue Rope; comes as a low-cost set of 3</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Dust Mask (1 or more per person)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Get a very low-priced <a href="#">20-pack</a></li> <li>Tip: If you end up having disaster cleanup, you will need lots of these masks. You will want the N95 masks, not just dust masks</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p><a href="#">Plastic Sheeting</a> &amp; <a href="#">Duct Tape</a> to shelter-in-place</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You may need to create a makeshift shelter-in-place room to protect your family from contaminants and chemical agents in the air</li> <li>You want to buy plastic sheeting that has a thickness of 4 mil or greater</li> </ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p><a href="#">Wipes</a>, <a href="#">Garbage Bags</a> and <a href="#">Plastic Ties</a> for sanitation</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p><a href="#">Gas/Water Shutoff Tool</a></p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p><a href="#">Manual Can Opener</a> for food (this is only if you're including canned food in your kit)</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Local Maps (buy at your local gas station or Walmart)</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p><a href="#">Backpack</a> to store all items in, ready to grab-and-go</p>
